## PLATE BORDER DESIGNS

Border patterns on export porcelain changed over time. This happened as new colors were introduced, as styles changed, and as fickle and wealthy customers demanded something fashionable and new. Below are some of the more popular border designs from the 1700s.



#### BLUE AND WHITE BORDER

Popular from the early 1600s through the 1800s



#### **IMARI BORDER**

(underglaze blue and overglaze red and gold enamels)

Most popular from about 1705 to 1730


### FAMILLE VERTE BORDER

(overglaze green, yellow, and purple enamels) Most popular from about 1705 to the 1730s



### IRON RED AND GOLD BORDER

Most popular from about 1715 to 1735

(diapering is a latticeworklike pattern of small diamonds or octagons) Most popular from about

**BORDER WITH PANELS** Most popular from about 1735 to 1755




